Message from Dr. Maureen Malowany, IMPH Alumni Academic Coordinator

Dear Alumni,

With a month until the end of classes and the Second Semester, our current students are struggling through the last stages of their COPC course and revisions to their proposals for Masters thesis or paper and projects for elective courses. In addition, they begin an intensive course on Monitoring &



Evaluation, taught by Dr. Segun Afolabi (Nigeria | IMPH 2005). All is not work – tours to Haifa, Caesarea, Acre and public health site visits coming up to Abu Ghosh and the Bedouin centres near Be'er Sheva in the Negev plus other events are planned as we move into summer.

IMPH Alumni West Africa Regional Conference – Cape Coast, Ghana, 24-28 February 2019

Our alumni have been equally busy! Forty-five IMPH alumni of a possible regional total of 122, counting graduates from 1973 but approximately 60 who graduated after 1995, from Cameroon, Côte d'Ivoire, Ghana, Liberia, Mali, Nigeria, Sierra Leone and The Gambia participated. They were joined by eight partially-funded alumni from Kenya (Raphael Mando Onyango, Grace Miheso, Ulo Benson Otieno, Jane Osindo) Russia (Kirill Danishevskiy), Turkey (Belgin Unal), Uganda (Vincent Batwala) and the United States (Anna Schmidt). Conference discussions were enhanced by the presence and work presented by these alumni from other regions.

As in previous years, planning for this Conference, we polled and debated among our alumni to set the Conference theme. West Africa Region alumni were concerned with the following issues: how to invest in the health workforce, improving the quality of health services, strengthening community systems for health advancement, expanding access to mental health services and developing a strategic approach towards achieving universal health care (UHC). We agreed on an umbrella theme "Strengthening Health Systems: Investing in the Future" that would encourage participants to report on their work within this framework, where appropriate, and to explore the regional strategies and decisions regarding UHC. We were very fortunate to have a senior

Ghanaian research consultant and policy-maker, Dr. Delanyo Dovlo, former Director, WHO-AFRO Health Systems Cluster, as Keynote Speaker. As the lead author of the WHO-AFRO policy report 'Leave No One Behind", Dr. Dovlo outlined the Report's major points and underlying strategies to meet WHO-AFRO targets, with particular reference to West Africa.

We are preparing a Declaration on the Conference Theme for distribution to policy makers, stakeholders, international agencies!








Alumni News
